

Governance of City Junior School

City Junior School is owned by and established as part of the City of London Corporation which, among its duties and responsibilities, acts as a local authority for the City of London.

City Junior School is governed by a sub-committee of the Boards of Governors of the City of London School and City of London School for Girls, acting as the 'City Junior School Board of Governors'. This Board of Governors has executive authority to make most decisions relating to City Junior School and its operation. However, matters of significant or strategic importance, and the school's budget and major financial decisions also require the oversight and agreement of the Boards of both City of London School for Girls and City of London School.

Our Board is made up of elected members of the City of London Corporation and co-opted Governors recruited to the Board. Executive power and responsibilities for governance of the school are delegated to these committees and sub-committees by the Court of Common Council of the City of London Corporation.

The City of London Corporation operates within defined governance rules for its schools, and this includes guidance on potential conflicts of interest. In practice, to avoid such potential conflicts of interest this has meant that current parents of pupils at the City of London's owned schools cannot serve as Governors (though parents of past pupils, if qualified, have been appointed as Governors).
